## Mildren to receive 2012 Leadership in Law award

OKLAHOMA CITY (JR) — Oklahoma City University Law Dean Valerie K. Couch will be the speaker for the Law Day luncheon May 1 at the Skirvin Hilton Hotel in downtown Oklahoma City.

Couch is a former U.S. magistrate judge for the Western District of Oklahoma. She is the 12th dean and first female dean of the Oklahoma City University School of Law, where she served as an adjunct faculty member for a decade. Couch was appointed U.S. magistrate judge in the U.S. District Court for the Western District in 1999. Prior to that she was in private practice with Hartzog Conger & Cason PC, where she was an associate from 1983 to 1988 and a director and shareholder from 1988 to 1999.

"This Law Day, we consider and celebrate the importance of our independent judiciary," said Laura McConnell-Corbyn, president of the Oklahoma County Bar Association. "The freedoms that we enjoy in this country are only ensured if we have three separate and independent branches of government. Our court system provides an invaluable check and balance to see that individual freedoms remain inviolate."

Law Day was conceived by the late Hicks Epton, a Wewoka attorney and past president of the Oklahoma Bar Association. President Dwight D. Eisenhower established Law Day nationally by presidential proclamation in 1958.
