Biography

He thoroughly enjoyed bringing leadership and innovation to preparing tomorrow's lawyers for the legal profession.

A devoted community advocate and public servant, he says, "public service feeds my soul," and Jim is currently a board member for Greater Oklahoma City United Way and Oklahoma Humane Society, and is a trustee for the City of Oklahoma City Economic Development Trust Authority.
